Circus Grimaldi request

Clayton Cox from Circus Grimaldi was present to request a location in the park to host a 1 day Circus. The date requested was August 25. The Park board felt the 18th St softball field would be the most ideal location. Currently the circus has shows in Corydon and Tell City. They would present 2 shows at 4:30 and 7:30. 30% of ticket proceeds would go to a local charity. This is a human based circus and all activities would take place beneath a 40x60 tent. Anticipated attendance would be 200-250 per show. The board requested Mike to send a lease form to Clayton with a suggested rate of \$250 for the day use of the softball field and lower shelterhouse.

500 lbs of grub treatment was applied to the soccer fields.


The football field has been sprayed with weed killer/preventer.
